3 Conjunction

The following conjunctions are used in Saliba: *yo* 'and' (it connects two noun phrases), and *na* 'and' (it connects two clauses).

- (1) Sina-gu yo tama-gu se hanoi-gai.
mother-1.SG and father-1.SG 3.PL wake.up-1.EXC
'My mother and my father woke us up.' [Mosel, 1994, p. 12]
- (2) mwauiyope yo baela buina-di
pawpaw and banana ripe-3.PL
'ripe pawpaws and bananas.' [Mosel, 1994, p. 20]
- (3) Huku-wa ka kau laei na ka wasabu.
fishing.line-DET 1.EXC tie take and 1.EXC run
'We tied it (the eel) with a fishing line (to the coconut tree) and ran away.'
[Mosel, 1994, p. 39]
